- **Fire Chief's Report**
 - **Chief Blair will be away from the office August 19-23. Deputy Chief Ferguson will be responsible for Chief Blair's duties in his absence**
 - **ISO Update**

The District staff met with Manuel Vasquez from ISO on July 30th and July 31st completing the review of the District's documentation. A short list of additional needs was created, most of which were completed by the morning of the 31st. Other information, such as additional fire hydrant flow data and Metro District pump and prv data was completed and sent off on August 15th. The initial results look very positive for an improvement to the District's current ISO rating of 6, 9, 10. Actual results are expected in 1 ½ to 2 months, once the formal review is completed.
 - **Update BOD on progress being made at Station #2, Parachute**

After the last month's decision to move forward with this project, staff has been fairly busy. Chief Blair met with the Rich Carter, the architect that designed the Battlement Mesa Station #1 and has him review the proposed plans for code compliance, feasibility and prepare attachments which can be used for RFP's to do the actual work. Mr. Carter should have the final revisions to the initial drawings completed by the BOD meeting. Additions to the project include code requirements to sprinkler the fire station to allow for residential occupancy, change out the existing heating and cooling system. Because the station is not to be used by the public, the District will not have to make it ADA compliant. The restriction against public access should only impact the Ladies Financial Planning meetings that are currently being held at this station once a month. We will ask the group to hold their meetings at the Battlement Mesa Fire Station and will make sure that they have full use of all the accommodations that were at the Parachute Fire Station, i.e. internet access, coffee and a place to meet.
 - **Sale of the District's 2006 Ford Explorer**

The District has received a sealed bid for the 2006 Ford Explorer for the BOD to consider.
 - **Status of Districts Apparatus repairs**

The District's Ladder truck is back in service. Repairs were completed and the apparatus was picked up from Front Range Fire Apparatus on August 02, 2013. It was placed back in service the following day, due to the late time of it's return. The District's Ambulance #33 air conditioning system repairs were completed August 9th. The ambulance was picked up from Columbine Ford and re-stocked and placed back in service the same day.

The District's Tender 32 pump repairs were completed by Munro Pump on August 8th. The tank has been resealed and tested. The rear discharge was found to be still leaking a significant amount, causing the tank to drain. The line from the discharge of the pump to tank was removed. The tank was re-repaired and sealed and found to be holding the water in the tank. The tender still has the 2 ½ side discharge functioning in order to off-load water under pressure. There are no further repairs to this truck planned at this time. The next repair will entail removing/replacing the tank and piping assemblies. The truck was scheduled to be replaced last year and has been moved to be replaced in the 2014 budget cycle. The District's remote area Engine #32 is currently getting the final repairs made to in order to return it to service. Chief Blair went to Greeley, CO on August 8th and brought back a used engine, which will fit in Engine #32. Stewart & Stevenson is currently swapping parts off the old to the new in order to get it ready to install. As of the time of preparing this agenda, they are waiting on a few additional gaskets and should be able to get it together, in and tested late next week.

- **Update on Wildland Crew activities**

Red crew will be presenting the "Introduction to Community Evacuation and Re-entry Planning talk, August 22nd, at 6:30 pm at the Battlement Mesa Station #1. Work has been progressing at the Parachute Water Reservoir building and home surveys. The crew has been out on several small fires and most recently were sent to assist with the Red Canyon Fire until federal resources could be sent to the fire.

- **Request to show the 1948 Mack Fire Truck at the Western Colorado Classic Auto Event**

Chief Blair has received a request to enter the District's 1948 Mack Fire Truck in the Western Colorado Classic Auto Event, to be held August 31st and September 1st at Canyon View Park in Grand Junction. Chief Blair would be responsible for getting it there and back if approved by the BOD.
